August Forums

August 7: The International Humanist and Ethical Union

Longtime Humanist Community member and leader Arthur Jackson will discuss the International Humanist and Ethical Union (IHEU at iheu.org), which represents humanism globally. Five organizations hosted the founding congress in 1952 in Amsterdam: the American Humanist Association, the American Ethical Union, the British Humanist Association, the Vienna Ethical Society, and the Dutch Humanist League. It has grown steadily since and now has 113 member organizations.

August 14: Unstoppable

Randolph Kundmueller will share a DVD from Commonwealth Club in which Ralph Nader discusses his book UNSTOPPABLE: The Emerging Left-Right Alliance to Dismantle the Corporate State. In this book, Mr. Nader explores the emerging political alignment of the Left and Right against converging corporategovernment tyranny. Large segments from the progressive, and libertarian political camps find themselves aligned in opposition to the destruction of civil liberties, the economically draining corporate welfare state, the relentless perpetuation of America's wars, sovereignty shredding trade agreements and the unpunished crimes of Wall Street against Main Street. Nader shows how Left-Right coalitions can prevail over the corporate state and crony capitalism.

August 21: The Snowden Incident

Longtime Humanist Community member Marc Perkel will discuss the actions, and the reactions to the actions, of Edward Snowden, who leaked large quantities of classified material.

August 28: Let's Teach Religion, All Religion, in Schools (featuring a TED Talk featuring Daniel Dennett)

In this 25 minute TED Talk video (see www.ted.com and www.ted.com/talks/dan_dennett_s_response_to_rick_warren) philosopher Daniel Dennett calls for religion — all religion — to be taught in schools, so we can understand it as a natural phenomenon. Then he takes on The Purpose-Driven Life, disputing its claim that, to be moral, one must deny evolution. After the video, the audience will discuss the ideas that the video presents.
